Updates and Information

Dear 4-H Member/Parent/Leader:

This is your copy of the 4-H Animal Science Book for the Ontario County Fair 2023. Please keep it in a handy spot for reference. Read it carefully to avoid errors. If you are looking for information about exhibit hall projects, please reference the Project Fairbook.

Pre-entry is required for all 4-H entries (both animal and projects). Entries are now only available via the FairEntry system. Directions on how to register are available in the first section of this Fairbook. **ALL ENTRIES ARE DUE IN THE 4-H OFFICE OR POSTMARKED BY JULY 1.**

There is a new lease policy. An exhibitor may request to lease up to three animals. If an exhibitor owns his or her own animals, they may still choose to lease up to three animals. THIS IS A COUNTY DECISION ONLY. State fair will still only allow youth to lease and exhibit one animal and only if youth do not already own an animal of his or her own. Standard lease paperwork must still be turned in with a project record book for each leased animal. Project record books may be obtained by requesting a copy from your educator. Fair cleanup will be Thursday July 13th starting at 5:00 PM and everyone who is taking part in the fair either as an animal exhibitor or in the exhibit hall must attend this set-up date. If you are unable to make this day, please let the 4-H educator know at least two weeks ahead of time so we can set up an alternate time for you to fulfill this requirement.

We look forward to seeing you at the Ontario County Fair. Exhibiting 4-H projects provides youth with valuable learning experiences and recognition. Exhibits also provide a venue for which the public can gain a sense of breadth and depth of 4-H projects and activities. If you have any questions about exhibiting at the fair, contact the 4-H office.

Step Two - Creating Entries for Exhibitors

Each exhibitor can have multiple entries. One entry must be made for each item, animal, class, etc. For example, if an exhibitor is bringing 2 photographs, two entries into the photography class must be created. If an exhibitor is showing one horse in 5 events, five class entries must be created. Once all entries have been created for the first exhibitor, you have the choice of creating another exhibitor in this exhibitor group (and entries) or proceeding to check-out (submitting the entries, whether or not fees are charged).

1. Click Add an Entry beside the correct exhibitor (if more than one has been created).

- Click Select beside the first department you wish to enter. Any departments that are not available for entry will be noted as "Not Available" with a short explanation.
- 3. After you select a department, you will see a list of divisions to select from, and then a list of available classes. Also notice that there are blue "Change" links in case you mistakenly select an incorrect department, division, or class.
- 4. After you have selected the class, click the green Choose button.

At this point, you will continue on with either the Multiple Entry process, or the Single Entry Process, depending on the option that your fair or show selected. The Multiple Entry process is described beginning on page 4, and single entries are described beginning on page 5.

Submitting Entries

When all entries for all exhibitors in the exhibitor group have been completed, **Continue to Payment** to finalize and submit your entries. You must submit your entries even if there are no fees, so no payment is required.

- 1. Review your entries for completeness and accuracy. *Notice the Summary and Detail buttons at the top of the list on the right.* If there are errors, click on the green Entries section at the top of the page. Click Continue when all information is correct.
- 2. Once all entries have been entered for exhibitors in your family, submit the invoice.
- 3. You will receive an email message when the entries have been submitted.

4-H ANIMAL SCIENCE RULES AND REGULATIONS 2023

<u>Deadlines:</u> The following are due to the 4-H office no later than the date listed below. <u>June 1st of the current year</u> - 4-H Horse Certificates and leased forms <u>July 1st of the current year</u> - 4-H Animal Entries July 1st: Rabies and Coggins Certificates for horses

Any form received after July 1st MUST have a written and signed explanation as to why the entry is <u>late</u>. If the entry form and written explanation is submitted late, then the matter is reviewed by the 4-H staff as to whether or not the 4-H member is allowed to participate. If the form is late again the next year, there will be no review and the exhibitor will not be allowed to participate.

- 1. 4-H members, in accordance with the Ontario County 4-H membership policy, must be enrolled with the Ontario County 4-H office by January 1 of the current year to be eligible to exhibit in the 4-H Division at the Ontario County Fair.
- 2. 4-H ownership of all animals as follows: Horses –May 1, Beef/Market Animals –May 1, and all other animals by June 1.
- 3. All animals must be on the grounds all week per instructions from the State Vet.
- 4. Exhibitors must show their own animals on the show day unless they are showing another species of animal in a performance class, which occurs at the same time. Alternate exhibitors must also be 4-H members. Please inform the Superintendents of both species and inform the 4-H Staff members prior to the shows.
- 5. All animal exhibitors are required to participate in the showmanship class for the species they are exhibiting.
- 6. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: PLEASE <u>READ</u> THE NYS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE & MARKETS ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENT BOOKLET FOR

THE CURRENT FAIR SEASON. (Changes are made every year to the requirements so, please read this booklet <u>every year</u>! The regulations can be found at :

7. Youth on Fairground Rules

Reminder: ALL parents are responsible for chaperoning of their children when they are on the fairgrounds or must obtain an adult chaperone <u>over</u> the age of 21 for them while not in attendance.

• NO 4-H YOUTH WILL STAY OVERNIGHT IN ANY BARN https://www.agriculture.ny.gov/

- No exhibitor may remain on the fairgrounds overnight unless under direct adult supervision with written parental permission. This permission slip will include a medical release form.
- We strongly recommend youth be accompanied by a parent at all times. They must have a completed medical release form, including parent contact information, with them in case of an accident. This form is available at <u>www.cceontario.org</u> in the 4-H forms section.

- All participants staying on the grounds in trailers or tents will be supervised by their parent or a guardian authorized by their parent.
- No unauthorized person will be allowed in the barns after 11:00 PM.
- There will be no community water tubs.
- Water fights of any kind in the barns or around the facilities where the public is <u>will not</u> be tolerated!
- Smoking is *not* permitted in or around the barns. There will be no use of illegal drugs or alcohol by participants. Participants may be dismissed if they are found with these substances.
- 8. Appropriate registration papers must accompany animals shown as registered breeding stock. Animals without registration papers will be shown as grades. Cattle will be shown in the same show at the same time.
- 9 Any animal exhibited by a youth member may be subject to drug testing as deemed necessary by the Superintendent, Educational Coordinator, 4-H Extension Educator, or Departments of Agriculture and Markets. In the event that a positive result is obtained, the youth will be barred from showing animals at the Ontario County Fair, forfeit all premium money and awards and will be referred to the Ontario County 4-H Office.
- 10 Each exhibitor must furnish enough feed and bedding for their own animals also feed boxes and water buckets. Each exhibitor is responsible for their own animal or secures another exhibitor to care for it.
- 11 The county fair exhibition constitutes a public display. All exhibitors are encouraged to always keep their animals and the building clean and attractive. Exhibitors are urged to conduct themselves and their exhibits in a manner to reflect credit on 4-H and their industries. Upon removal of their animals from the exhibit, the exhibitors are required to leave the areas that have been occupied by their animals clean of straw and manure, and ready for occupancy. Straw and manure must be removed from the barn. Animal Superintendents will give direction for this to exhibitor.
- 12 No 4-H animals may be sold on the fairgrounds.
- 13 Weeklong fair passes can be obtained from the Ontario County Fair Office or via the new FairEntry system.
- 14 In the event premium money is deleted or decreased from the New York State budget, premiums will be adjusted accordingly.
- 15 <u>Advance entry sheets are required for all animal exhibits and club display areas only.</u> Please pay close attention to the entry deadlines. Animal entry forms are included in the FairEntry information sent to members.
- 16 For submissions guidelines for Section AA class 2, please refer to the Project Fairbook. An animal science item such as a rope halter, record book, animal first aid kit, etc. will be judged on exhibit judging day and exhibited in the youth building

17 Note about 4-H Cloverbuds Showing Animals

- Be sure to read the rules and regulations in the section of your animal.
- There is a limit of one animal per species for Cloverbuds to enter at the fair.

RESPONSIBLITIES OF EACH 4-H ANIMAL EXHIBITOR

- a. Cleanliness of each animal and exhibitor
- b. Stall or pen area manure removed, appropriate bedding
- c. Food and water supplied for the animal
- d. Cleanliness of the animal area including sweeping and raking
- e. Organization of tack in the appropriate storage area
- f. Identification of area
- g. Cooperation with animal superintendent and other exhibitors
- h. Cooperation and interaction with those attending the fair to share a positive image of 4-H to the public coming to the fair.

The Danish System is the primary system of judging the 4-H shows and exhibits. Each exhibit is evaluated by the judge on its own merit and is not compared to others in the same lot. Evaluation is based on the quality of the exhibit with consideration to the exhibitor's age and experience in the project. There are certain areas where competitive judging may take place as well.

MOST IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM VETERINARIANS:

When you are loading your livestock for the trip to the fair, take the time to examine them. Make sure they are the same animals that are on the paperwork If your animal is showing any sign of illness **LEAVE THEM HOME**.

4-H ANIMAL SCIENCE

GENERAL ANIMAL SCIENCE PROJECTS Department 51

Class:

- 1. A completed 4-H project book: Due date July 13th (Fair cleanup). No late books will be accepted.
- 2. Costume Class

(Large Animal) – Dairy and Beef cattle *will need to submit animal name and costume choice 24 hours before class*

(Small Animal) – Sheep, Goat, Poultry, Rabbit, Cavy *will need to submit animal name and costume choice 24 hours before class*

Educational Contests:

The contests below are open to any youth interested in the animal species regardless of if that youth is exhibiting that species in the county fair animal shows.

- 4. Poultry Science Contest: This competition focuses on evaluating the quality of various poultry products, broken into 6 categories: Interior egg quality (candling), interior egg quality (broken out), exterior egg quality, meat part ID, ready to cook broiler quality, and past egg production (with oral reasons). The competition is structured after the state and national competition and is based on the National Poultry Judging Manual from Nebraska State University. 4-Hers are encouraged to participate even if they have minimal or no knowledge of judging, as it is meant to be a learning experience.
- **5.** Avian Bowl: This is structured after the state and national competition but will be in the form of a written test with questions about anything poultry related, whether it is breed characteristics, diseases, food preparation, poultry housing, etc. The questions will be created from several pages of the National 4-H Avian Bowl Manual and change from year to year. The selected pages will be announced/provided prior to the fair to allow for studying. If needed, the questions can be read to contestants.
- 6. Poultry Barbeque Contest: This competition is composed of three parts. First, participants will have two hours to cook four (4) bone-in, skin-on chicken thighs (provided at the beginning of the competition) on a charcoal grill. While cooking, contestants are evaluated on their BBQ and food safety skills. The meat is then evaluated by judges based on appearance and taste, which is the second part. The third part is a small, informal presentation about the commercial broiler industry, food safety, and nutrition of chicken. This is not meant to discourage competitors, and polished presentations are not expected. The main goal is for competitors to demonstrate a basic awareness of the poultry industry and of the meat that is being prepared. The presentation can be a PowerPoint, poster, or be given completely orally from note cards. The scoresheet with criteria is available so that contestants know what they need to include.
- 7. **Rabbit Decathlon**: This contest tests a participant's knowledge of rabbit care and showing. Youth move around to different stations that test their knowledge of rabbit breeds, nutrition, health, standards for judging, etc.

4-H BEEF Department 60

- All 4-H beef exhibitors are required to participate in Showmanship classes. Each contestant may show his/her own animal, but during the contest, may be asked to show some other animal.
- All animals will be shown by breed and judged on the Danish System.

Pack Goat Classes

Pack goats must be 6 months of age or older and may be withers, fertile or sterile does, or hermaphrodites. Two pack goat classes are offered. The first is Showmanship and Fitting class where you are asked to enter the ring with no pack on your goat. You will then need to tie your goat with a quick release knot to put the pack on while the judge observes for fit and willingness of the animal. The exhibitor should carry in their own pack or on their person the following emergency survival essentials: filled one liter water bottle, no-cook snacks, map, compass, sunscreen, insect repellent, first-aid kit, fire-starter kit in waterproof container, flashlight/headlamp with extra batteries, whistle, signaling mirror, strong twine or rope, and an emergency space blanket. Fire starter kit should not include real matches; instead, please use an empty match box or match book. Additional essentials/supplies may be carried in the goat's pack. The second class is a Trail Challenge class. These classes are intended specifically for pack goat projects. The youth must train their goats to pack and condition their goats by accompanying them on walk or hikes. Dairy and meat does that have been trained for packing may show in their appropriate dairy or meat goat shows as well as in the pack goat show. Meat and pack goats with horns are allowed, but aggressive horned goats may be required to be artificially tipped or required to leave the fairgrounds at the discretion of the superintendent. We will offer Cloverbud, novice, junior and senior level classes. A "soft pack" must be used in our show. Dress code: Pack goat club t-shirt, jeans, boots, or sneakers. No open toed shoes.

Except for showmanship, all classes are judged in their cage. The judge will walk from cage to cage for the evaluation, and exhibitors do not need to be present. All entries will be judged according to the American Standard of Perfection and will receive a blue, red, or white ribbon. Prizes will be awarded accordingly.

Cloverbuds are only allowed to enter one bird, which is for exhibition only and will receive a participation ribbon. They are encouraged to also participate in the Cloverbud Mini Size Pet Show and the Animal Costume Class during fair week. *Note: these two events are separate from the poultry show, and are for multiple species*

Showmanship is mandatory for all exhibitors (including Cloverbuds). The 4-H Fitting and Showmanship Members Guide from Michigan State provides a good overview of what may be asked of you. Dress code for showmanship is black pants, a white shirt, and closed toe footwear. The competition will start with Cloverbuds, then progress to Novice, Junior, and Senior. The top two Juniors and top two Seniors will then be called back to compete for Master Showman. On occasion Novice may also be included in Master Showmanship, but only at the discretion of the judge.

All families that exhibit poultry MUST select an evening to supervise the poultry barn from 6:00 PM - 8:00 PM or 8:00 PM - 10:00 PM. The 8:00 PM - 10:00 PM shift will be responsible for closing the barn for the night, and any youth 14 or over may do so. If you do not select an evening that works best for you, one will be assigned. If unable to stay and help due to circumstances, you need to make arrangements with another family exhibiting poultry.

Rules and Guidelines:

- 1. Animals will go through an animal check-in with the state vets before entering the exhibit barn. Any entries with lice, mites, or other problems will be asked to leave the fairgrounds.
- 2. Cages will be assigned prior to exhibitor's arrival at the fair and are not to be moved by the exhibitor without approval by the superintendent.
- 3. Judging of birds will occur sometime during the week. Birds should be ready to be judged when caged on Tuesday.
- 4. Entries are to be caged in the poultry barn by 10:00 AM on Tuesday.
- 5. Exhibitors are limited to 15 fair entries, with the Market Pen being one entry. Cloverbuds are limited to one entry. If the total number of exhibits is high, the poultry superintendent may reduce the number of birds able to be shown per exhibitor.
- 6. Feed and water cups are provided, but exhibitors are to provide their own feed and must care for their bird(s) at least twice a day, in the morning and evening. If this is not possible, the exhibitor is responsible for making arrangements with someone to check their animals. Please communicate this to the poultry superintendent.
- 7. Exhibitors should consider the possibility of exhibits being lost, strayed, or stolen during fair week. Care will be taken to prevent losses, but superintendents and the Fair Association cannot assume responsibility.
- 8. Do not open any cages of birds that do not belong to you unless you have clear permission from the owner.
- 9. All poultry except waterfowl and pigeons shall have originated from US pullorum-typhoid clean or equivalent flocks or have a negative pullorum test within 90 days of the Fair. The pullorum certificate must be sent in with entries. (Photocopies are acceptable)
- 10. All birds are to be removed from the building by 9:00 AM on Sunday unless other arrangements are made with the superintendent in advance.
- 11. Cages and feed/water dishes must be cleaned by the exhibitor upon removing the birds.
- 12. Failure to clean cages or to follow rules in general will result in no ribbon or premiums to the exhibitor.

Showmanship and Avian Bowl will run concurrently. Seniors will take the avian bowl test while the Juniors complete showmanship, and vice versa

The following poultry competitions are open to any 4-H'er aged 8-18 as of January 1st of the current year. All are welcome regardless of experience, including those who are not exhibiting birds.

Avian Bowl: This is structured after the state and national competition but will be in the form of a written test with questions about anything poultry related, whether it is breed characteristics, diseases, food preparation, poultry housing, etc. The questions will be created from several pages of the National 4-H Avian Bowl Manual and change from year to year. The selected pages will be announced/provided prior to the fair to allow for studying. If needed, the questions can be read to contestants.

Poultry Science: This competition focuses on evaluating the quality of various poultry products, broken into 6 categories: interior egg quality (candling), interior egg quality (broken out), exterior egg quality, meat part ID, ready to cook broiler quality, and past egg production (with oral reasons). The competition is structured after the state and national competition and is based on the National Poultry Judging Manual from Nebraska State University. 4-H'ers are encouraged to participate even if they have minimal or no knowledge of judging, as it is meant to be a learning experience.

Chicken BBQ: **Changed from previous years** This competition is composed of three parts. First, participants will have two hours to cook four (4) bone-in, skin-on chicken thighs (provided at the beginning of the competition) on a charcoal grill. While cooking, contestants are evaluated on their BBQ and food safety skills. The meat is then evaluated by judges based on appearance and taste, which is the second part. The third part is a small, informal presentation about the commercial broiler industry, food safety, and nutrition of chicken. This is not meant to discourage competitors, and polished presentations are not expected. The main goal is for competitors to demonstrate a basic awareness of the poultry industry and of the meat that is being prepared. The presentation can be a PowerPoint, poster, or be given completely orally from note cards. The scoresheet with criteria is available so that contestants know what they need to include.

- Only one entry can be made in this class per exhibitor.
- This class is for 4-H Project Rabbits that are of unknown or mixed breed origin.
- Rabbits in this class cannot be shown in any of the purebred classes.
- Rabbits that have one or more disqualifications per ARBA Standards can also be entered in this Pet Care Class.
- These rabbits do not need to have permanent identification unless the exhibitor is planning to exhibit the animal at state fair.

4-H Meat Class Rabbit

- Entries in these classes are limited to 6 commercial rabbit breeds only.
- There will be NO Fancy rabbit breeds entered in this division.
- The rabbits may NOT be older than 10 weeks.
- Weight of each individual rabbit in either class must not be less than 3 lbs. and not more than 5 lbs. Rabbits will be weighed in on entry day.
- Rabbits shown as fryers cannot be shown as Jr. Bucks and Jr. Does in other breed classes.

4-H SHEEP Department 68
